Parents and Caregivers,

This is my last newsletter article for this term as I go on Long Service Leave for six weeks. Thanks to digital technologies I will be able to share my adventures with staff and students as I travel overseas with friends.

Nadia Cusselli will take over as Principal for the remainder of the term supported by Stacey Scott as Wellbeing Leader. You can be confident that the school is in good hands with Nadia and Stacey competently leading our focus of improvement in Reading and Attendance.

On Wednesday we met with all students as a group to discuss some lapses of behaviour, including rough play in the yard and persistent disrespect for students and staff – swearing, insolence, bullying and intimidation. Admittedly this does not apply to all students and the majority are compliant and have high expectations of themselves. Unfortunately, a school's reputation is rarely built on its positive aspects. We are asking for your support to discuss with your child appropriate behaviours at school which includes respectful behaviour towards adults.

While our behaviour data shows that incidents of Suspensions and Take Homes are declining we will be vigilantly following our Behaviour Code and sending students home for 1-5 days for abuse of staff and persistently refusing to follow reasonable instructions.

I also spoke to the students about the blatant refusal to wear our school uniform. As most of our students now comply with this policy the small group who don't are easily identifiable and stand out in classrooms and the yard. The dress code is an expectation at our school and must be supported by families otherwise the message students are getting from home is that *'it's okay to break the rules'*.

Well done to C7 for achieving 84.6% for Attendance in the last 2 weeks! They celebrated their reward after Assembly today.

They were closely followed by C6 on 83.8%, C5 on 82.1%, 79.5% and B3 on 72.6%.

In Week 10 of this term there will be a celebration/reward for individual students who have attended 90% and above since the beginning of the year. So far we have 49 students whose attendance is already 90% and above ... remember the Education Department's target is 95%.

I will see you all on my return to school at the beginning of Term 3.
